(The Registration Act 1908)

Q No. 7: Discuss the implications of non registration of a document which is otherwise liable to be registered. (10 Marks)

Q No. 8: Describe the nature of documents required to be compulsorily registered under The Registration Act, 1908. (10 Marks)

PART-IV

(The Qanoon e Shahadat Order 1984)

Q No. 9: Discuss in detail the doctrine of estoppel & compare estoppel with double jeopardy in Criminal Proceeding. (15 Marks)

Q No. 10: Define and describe burden of proof in civil and criminal proceedings. Illustrate when the onus shifts from one to the other party. (15 Marks)
